Learning, Reviewing, & Owning Another Masechta

The Global Oraysa Movement to Celebrate Milestone Siyum on Maseches Pesachim

Thousands of men and their families will be gathering next week in locations around the world to celebrate a momentous siyum and simchas hatorah upon the completion of a complex and challenging Masechtah. These scores of dedicated men are the participants in the Oraysa Amud V'Chazara program, which has taken the Torah world by storm since its initiation just several years ago.

The Oraysa Amud V'Chazara program's innovative format calls for lomdim to study one Amud a day, 5 days a week, in a thorough manner, simultaneously undertaking a scheduled chazarah program of what they are learning. Each day, the previous day's Amud is reviewed, and a new one learned for the first time. Friday and Shabbos are dedicated to reviewing the 2-and-a-half blatt learnt over the week. Thus, each Amud is learned, understood and mastered.

The handy, easy-to-use calendar is one of the many beneficial resources produced by Oraysa. It provides a clear outline of the program and one's ongoing progress. Additionally, the Oraysa website and phone line feature excellent Magidei Shiur in English, Yiddish and Hebrew teaching the p'shat of each Amud Gemara, in addition to having valuable resources for those that want to learn more in-depth, such as iyun shiurim on the Amud.

Furthermore, they provide all lomdim with the "Yalkut Oraysa", a masterfully created booklets of marei mekomos and explanations, which are

utilized as important aids to help with the learning by thousands of lomdim.

A bi-weekly optional bechina is given every other Sunday on the five blatt learned over the course of the past two weeks. The bechina is a valuable tool for testing one's knowledge and promoting retention, motivating participants to do additional, pre-bechina reviews at the end of each month.

Over time, the program has continued to grow in popularity. With the start of each new Masechta, more and more men have joined and more and more chaburos have been founded in communities worldwide.

The largest siyum on Pesachim will be held next Tuesday, May 23rd, in Lake Terrace Hall in Lakewood. Many other large siyumim will be held in communities around Eretz Yisroel, Europe and all over the United States and Canada.

Lomdei Oraysa are now set to begin Masechtas Rosh Hashana, which will be completed just in time for Rosh Hashanah 5784!

The start of Masechtas Rosh Hashana is a great time to get on board and to benefit from all Oraysa has to offer to those with a strong desire to learn, retain and know Shas!
